Father Thomas' Corner

What is ADVENT? Advent is a period of spiritual preparation in which many Christians make themselves ready for the birth of the Lord, Jesus Christ. Advent typically involves a season of prayer, fasting and repentance, followed by anticipation, hope and joy.

Last week we were reminded of what each of the four candles of the Advent Wreath symbolize. What many do not realize is that the wreath is equally symbolic and beautiful.

The wreath is made of various evergreens, signifying continuous life. The laurel signifies victory over persecution and suffering; pine, holly, and yew, immortality; and cedar, strength and healing. The prickly leaves of the holly also remind us of the crown of thorns. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life of Christ. Any pine cones, nuts, or seedpods used to decorate the wreath symbolize life and resurrection. All together, the wreath of evergreens symbolizes the immortality of our soul and the new, everlasting life of Christ. It reminds us of the eternal Word of the Father, who entered our

If you had pictures from the directory photo sessions delivered to the office, they have been arriving all week!!! You can find them on the table at the back of church.




