WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ

Every year we remember in a special our Baptismal call to mission as we celebrate World Mission Sunday, this year on October 18. On this Sunday, we will gather at the Eucharist, as will Catholics throughout

the world, in a spirit of love for Evangelization so that, through our prayers and concrete acts of solidarity, the gift of faith may be shared with all. This year's celebration is further enriched as we mark the 50th anniversary of the Second Vatican Council's Decree on the Missionary Activity of the Church (Ad Getes) which proclaims, "The pilgrim Church on earth is missionary by its very nature," reminding us that all of us are called to be on mission.

In his message for World Mission Sunday, Pope Francis writes, "Mission is part of the 'grammar' of faith, something essential for those who listen to the voice of the Spirit who whispers 'Come' and 'go forth.' Those who follow Christ cannot fail to be missionaries..."

On World Mission Sunday, as our diocesan family joins our brothers and sisters around the world responding to the voice of the Spirit, we connect with our world on mission:...with Africa, where six million children receive an education in some 16,000 Church-run elementary schools...with Asia, where those who are sick are provided with loving care at 5,000 Catholic hospitals and small clinics ...with the Americas, where catechists travel to remote areas to bring the Good News of God's great love to families...with Oceania, where young men are supported, in their studies for the priesthood, to bring the Lord's healing hope and peace to those in need...with Europe, where new churches are being built to welcome faith communities, renewed after years of persecution.

Your financial help on World Mission Sunday, offered in the collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, supports such efforts in 1,150 young mission dioceses in our world, reaching the poorest communities with a message of hope and healing, mercy and peace. Additionally, beginning this year, a portion of your gift will be used to support our own diocesan mission efforts as we reach out to the poorest of the poor in Bolivia, the Philippines, Uganda and the Navajo Nation. Each year medical and construction teams, as well as teams of university students, travel to these places as representatives of our diocese, and perhaps of your parish, to work in partnership with local dioceses and religious communities, bringing hope and assistance to our brothers and sisters in need. Pope Francis emphasizes that "mission is a passion for Jesus and at the same time a passion for his people." Let us have that same passion this World Mission Sunday, as we share the joy of the Gospel and help the poor by our fervent prayer and through generous hearts!

The Word From Father Thomas

OCTOBER IS THE MONTH OF THE ROSARY

This month we will celebrate the month of the rosary with a special **ROSARY DEVOTION**. We will begin this 10 day devotion on October 22 thru October 31. Father Thomas will be available for confession at 6PM each evening.

The devotion will begin at 6:30PM with Mass, followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, praying of the Rosary, and ending with the Benediction.

This 10 day devotion insures **plenary indulgence**, which is when a person must exclude all attachment to sin of any kind, even venial sin, must perform the work or say the prayer for which the indulgence is granted, and must also fulfill the three conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and praying for intentions of the Pope.

*Note the following exceptions

Sunday October 25, the devotion will NOT be in the evening, it will begin at 9:30AM with a LIVING Rosary of our RE children and ending with Mass. There will be coffee and doughnuts in the hall at 9AM for breakfast and fellowship until the service.

Saturday October 31, the devotion service will start with confession at 4PM and Rosary at 4:30PM, followed by Mass.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

Our Lady of Lourdes CCD classes will be participating in this wonderful program again this year. Last year, several classes packed gift shoe boxes for children who may otherwise have had no Christmas. Our goal this year is to have each class participate by filling one box for a boy, and one box for a girl. The age range can be the same as the age of the students in that class. Please have each child bring one, unwrapped gift (\$5 or less), plus \$1 (to pay for the shipping of each box).

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "The catechetical tradition also recalls that there are sins that cry to heaven" (CCC 1867). Then it lists certain sins from Scripture. What does "catechetical tradition" mean?

Sacred tradition is the revealed word of and beliefs. It has always been a part of our Church, and while distinct from Scripture, the two "merge into a unity and tend toward the same end" (Dei Verbum, 9). A "catechism" is a collection of these truths that helps people to understand and live our faith. Jesus was the first teacher, and our tradition continues unbroken, from apostolic preaching to the Magisterium. Christian principles-for example, respect for life and human dignity—are unchanging but need to be interpreted for the day in which we live. This explains the need for various catechisms and diverse religious practices across nations and cultures.

The sins listed—murder, rape, God as transmitted in Christian teachings oppression, and other human injustices are all found in the Old Testament. When people are sinned against, they cry out. Think of parents mourning the death of their child who was killed by a drunk driver, or victims of human trafficking or torture. These sins reach heaven, and God assures them that their cry is heard. Of course, God acknowledges and cares about other sins, too. "[All] sin is an offense against God...Sin sets itself against God's love for us and turns our hearts away from it" (CCC 1850).
