

The Church dedicates the month of September to Our Lady of Sorrows, also known as Mater Dolorosa (Mother of Sorrows). This devotion recalls the Blessed Virgin Mary's spiritual martyrdom in virtue of her perfect union with the Passion of Christ. This was her role in salvation history, and what merited her place as the spiritual Mother of all Christians. This is symbolized by a single sword, or seven swords, piercing Mary's suffering heart, as foretold in Simeon's prophecy. Traditionally the Church meditates on the "Seven Sorrows" of our Blessed Mother: the prophecy of Simeon; the Holy Family's flight into Egypt; the loss of the Child Jesus for three days; the meeting of Mary and Jesus as he carried his cross; Jesus' crucifixion and death; Jesus' sacred body taken down from the cross; and Jesus' burial. *The feast of Our Lady of Sorrows is September 15th*.

The <u>Parish Picnic</u> is still on for September 26th after Sunday 11:00 mass but we do need an <u>RSVP</u> as soon as possible on how many plan to come. Due to the Covid restrictions we are doing things a little different this year.

- 1. We are doing a potluck, however due to COVID we can only accept pre packaged foods.
- 2. There will be a bounce house for children, but we are limiting it to same family use only, with cleaning in-between.
- 3. Since this is outdoors, masks are not required, but can be used if it makes you feel comfortable.

The church will provide the hamburgers and hots dogs along with the buns, ketchup and mustard. The church will also provide the usual paper plates and plastic silverware.

Good News!

Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) Is 50:4c-9a; Jas 2:14-18; Mk 8:27-35

Faith or Works? Unfortunately, these two facets of our faith are often pitted against each other. In many of his letters, St. Paul insists on the superiority of faith, while today's reading from St. James underscores the importance of good works. It is understandable that one might get confused. Actually, both are vital. In fact, one without the other does not result in full Christian living. At issue is how they fit

Paul's insistence on faith was probably a corrective for the erroneous belief that we can earn eternal happiness by our good works. This was not simply a problem with the Jewish law and practices but with the religious law and practices of many societies. Even today we find people convinced that obeying religious laws assures salvation. To this, Paul insisted that it was faith in Jesus that saved, not conformity to law. Paul never said that believers should not obey the law. Rather, he would insist that such obedience should flow from faith, not vice versa.

It seems that the people to whom today's second reading was directed took the idea of "faith alone" to an extreme. They were not committed to good works. This letter corrected that error. It states that faith without works is dead. In fact, good works demonstrate the authenticity and depth of one's faith.

The message for today should be clear. Faith and works belong together. Genuine faith manifests itself in works of love and mercy, and the works of love and mercy that flow from faith are of God.

Our Lord Jesus Christ, Himself, revealed to Blessed Veronica of Binasco "My daughter, tears shed for My Passion are dear to Me; but as I loved My Mother Mary with an immense love, the meditation on the torments which She endured at My death is even more pleasing to Me."

Mary will show us a grateful love, and, with her own most marvelous blessing, will bless those who, by compassion of her Sorrows, show themselves the most truly to be her children, and give the sweetest consolation to her afflicted heart.

- 1) The Prophecy of Simeon (Luke 2: 22-35)
- 2) The Flight Into Egypt (Matthew 2:12-23)
- 3) The Loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple (Luke 2:41-52)
- 4) Mary Meets Jesus on the Way to Calvary (23:27) The meeting between Jesus and his mother on the way of the cross is

not recorded in any of the Gospels, but we know that there were women who followed him on the way and we know that Mary was at the foot of the cross with St John, so it isn't unreasonable that she and Jesus should have met as he was carrying the cross. It is also a strong tradition of the Church, commemorated both in the devotion of the Seven Sorrows of Mary and in the Stations of the Cross.

- 5) Jesus Dies on the Cross John 19:25-37)
- 6) Mary Receives Jesus (Matthew 27:55-56) Only in the 13 station of the Cross do we hear specifically Of Jesus being placed in this Mothers arms.
- 7) Jesus is Placed in the Tomb (Luke 23:50-56)
