Lc 4:27-29 Again, there were many lepers in Israel during the time of Elisha the prophet; yet not one of them was cleansed, but only Naaman the Syrian." When the people in the synagogue heard this, they were all filled with fury. They rose up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town had been built, to hurl him down headlong.



Some people don't like their names and seek to legally change them or to use a nickname instead. Names convey meanings. "Thor" sounds like a mythical god carrying a hammer. "Vesuvius" sounds like a boiling volcano about to erupt. And "Jesus" sounds like a God-man beyond reproach. A child, when once asked to define love, said that "when someone loves you, the way they say your name is different. Your name is safe in their mouth." The Holy Name of Jesus should be safe in our mouths even when we're not receiving communion.

Son of Mary, may our same tongues that receive Your Holy Body and Blood prepare ourselves for Your visit by saying You're the Holy Name of Jesus with great reverence. And may we not refrain from invoking that same Holy Name of Jesus in our daily conversations with all whom we meet.

Divine Mercy—Purification The greatest suffering, we can endure is a spiritual longing for God. Those in Purgatory suffer greatly because they long for God and do not yet fully possess Him. We must enter into the same purification here and now. We must let ourselves long for God. We must see God and realize we do not yet fully possess God and that He does not yet fully possess us because of our sin. This will be painful but is necessary if we are to be purified of all that keeps us from His perfect Mercy (See Diary #20-21). Reflect upon the fact that the

spiritual purification of your soul is necessary. Ideally, we will all embrace this purification here and now. Why wait? Do you seek to grow in this purification? Are you willing to let your soul long for God and have Him as your one desire? If so, all else in life will fall into place as you seek God and as you discover the Divine Mercy that awaits you.

Prayer: Lord, please do **purify** my soul in every way. Allow me to enter into my purgatory here and now. Let my soul become consumed with a longing for you God and let that desire overshadow every other desire in my life. **Come to Confession to cleans your soul**. Jesus wants you to choose him. Jesus, I trust in You.

Please try and pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet everyday at 3:00pm if possible, for this is when our Lord Jesus Christ gave us everything, his life for ours.

Good News!

January 30, 2022 Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C) Jer 1:4-5, 17-19; 1 Cor 12:31–13:13 or 13:4-13; Lk 4:21-30

Paul's praise of love from the second reading is a favorite passage for weddings where it acts as a set of promises the bridal couple make to each other. They seem to be saying: "This is the way I am going to act, because I love you. I promise to put you ahead of me." And they genuinely mean it. They're convinced the passion they feel, the concern they experience, will be all that's needed to transcend any future difficulties they might face.

Soon, reality sets in and they realize that the list is really a strategy for scaling the heights of unselfishness or critically examining the conscience to reveals one's failures. This is not to say that people do not genuinely love each other. They do. But we are all so human, and selfishness is a weakness to which we are all susceptible. Perhaps Paul should have written: "Love tries to be patient, love tries to be kind...."

In a way, it is precisely in the give-and-take that occurs between imperfect humans that all the wonderful characteristics listed by Paul are refined. Our impatience is worn away as we deal sympathetically with the disagreeable traits of our loved ones. We become humble when those who should encourage us fail to acknowledge accomplishments that might otherwise inflate our egos. These are the slights we endure because we love the other person. Actually, such humble endurance *is* evidence that love truly is patient and kind. *Sr. Dianne Bergant, CSA* **8 weeks** Fingers and toes. Your baby has fingers and toes now – and they're webbed! Her hands are flexed at the wrist and meet over her heart. She now has knees, and her legs may be long enough that her feet meet in front of her body. Getting ready to breathe. Your baby's respiratory system is forming.



16 weeks—Your baby is now constantly doubling up in size and weight. Your baby has gotten so big that its tiny heart is pumping about 6.6 gal (25 I) of blood daily, and this quantity will only keep increasing. In the womb, your baby at 16 weeks has complete mobility in limbs and joints



24 weeks—The Baby now weighs about 1.4 pounds now. It responds to sounds by moving or increasing its pulse. You many notice jerking motions if Baby has hiccups. With the inner ear full developed, Baby may be able to sense being upside down in the womb.

32 weeks to 8 months — Baby weighs 3 3/4 pounds and is about 16.7 inches long, taking up a lot of space in your uterus. You're gaining about a pound a week and roughly half of that goes right to your baby. Baby is kicking as his space is getting smaller. Baby can <u>focus</u> on large objects that are not too far away, and this ability to focus will stay that way until birth. His toenails and fingernails have grown in, along with real hair. Only 4 more weeks Mom & Dad. I'll see you soon!

Help save the unborn children at risk of being aborted. Please pray the child and his mother and father and for an end to abortion every day until the unborn child will no longer legally be ripped from his mother's womb. These children have no voice yet. You and I need to speak up for them. Every life is precious gift from God.
